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ATTENTION ALL OHIO EMS AGENCIES

On November 30, 2016, version 2 of the EMS Incident Reporting System (EMSIRS-2) will stop accepting data. It will be taken offline permanently at the end of December. EMSIRS version 3 will be available for use soon. The EMSIRS-3 Data Dictionary can be found in our [Data Center](#).

If You Enter Your Data Directly into Our Website

If you enter your data directly into our website, the new website is <https://oh.centralsiteportal.com/>. If your agency has not requested access credentials for the new system yet, you will need to send a request for credentials to EMSdata@dps.ohio.gov. We will send you a form that must be completed by the Chief / CEO of your organization.

If You Use a Software Package to Collect Your Data

If you use a software package to collect your data your vendor will need to be compliant with EMSIRS-3 or with NEMSIS 3.4. Below is a listing of vendors known to either be compliant with these standards or are in process:

There are two methods of data submission from a software package to EMSIRS. Your vendor will be able to tell you which method to use.

1. The first method is automatic upload. In this method your software package automatically sends the ePCR record when the record is complete.
2. The other method is manual upload. This method is similar to what you are doing now, creating an export file from your software, logging in to the new EMSIRS site and uploading the file. Information on the website for uploading, credentialing, etc., will follow.

If Your Vendor Is Not On the List Above

If your vendor is not on the list above you need to contact them *as soon as possible* to determine their status. If the vendor is not working towards version 3 compliance or if you are unsatisfied with their response, contact the EMS Office of Research and Analysis at EMSdata@dps.ohio.gov and we will be happy to send you the compliant vendor list and contact information.
