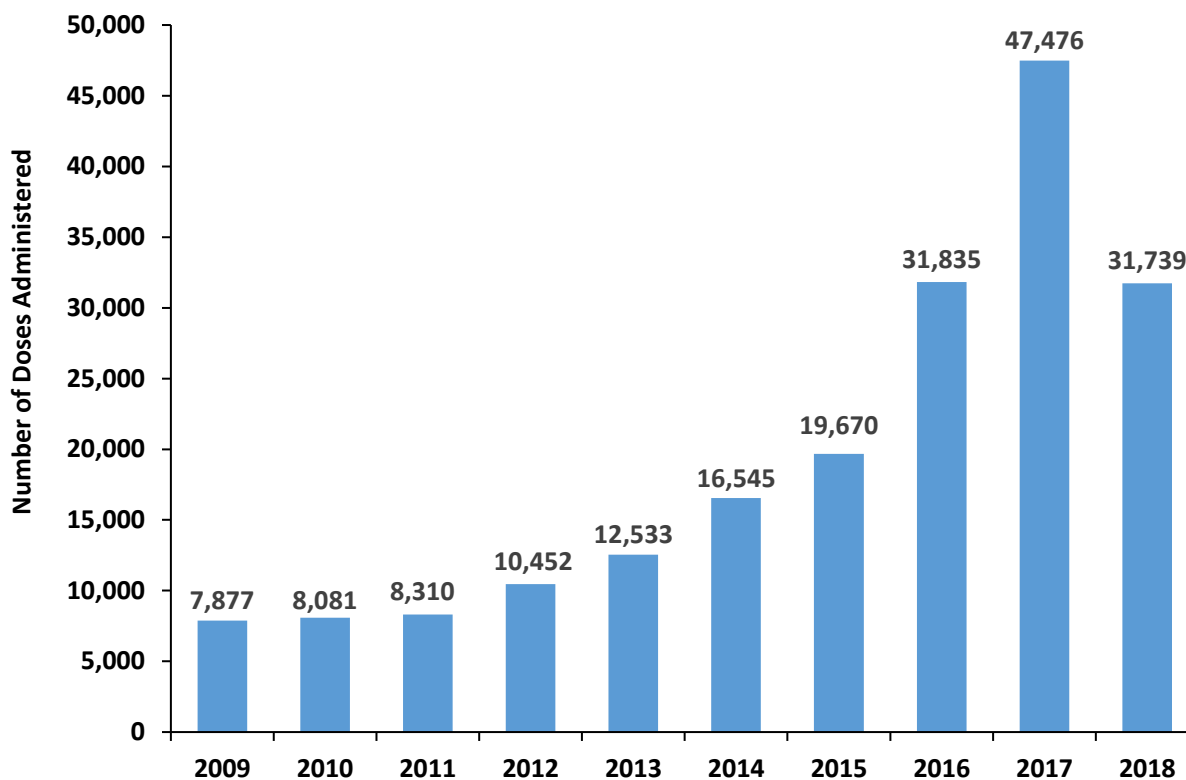


## Naloxone Administration by Ohio EMS Providers, 2009-2018<sup>1,2,3,4,5,6</sup>

### Summary Brief as December 31, 2018

<sup>2</sup> Reported naloxone administration data for "Out of Ohio" and "Blank/Unknown" counties and ZIP codes for CY2009 – CY2012 have been removed to eliminate data integrity concerns between multiple EMSIRS and national guidelines.

<sup>3</sup> The data includes naloxone administrations where county was not recorded (blank/unknown) n=140 (2016), n=91 (2017) and n=63 (2018).

<sup>4</sup> Naloxone doses administered in out of state ZIP codes are excluded.

<sup>5</sup> As of December 31, 2018, 783 of the 1,055 known transporting EMS agencies (74.2%) in 2017 reported through EMSIRS; the 1,055 agency count is prior to agency mergers that have taken place in 2018.

<sup>6</sup> As of December 31, 2018, 816 of the 1,013 known transporting EMS agencies (80.6%) in 2018 reported through EMSIRS.

The accuracy of data reported to EMSIRS is limited by the number of individual EMS agencies submitting data and the accuracy of these submissions.
