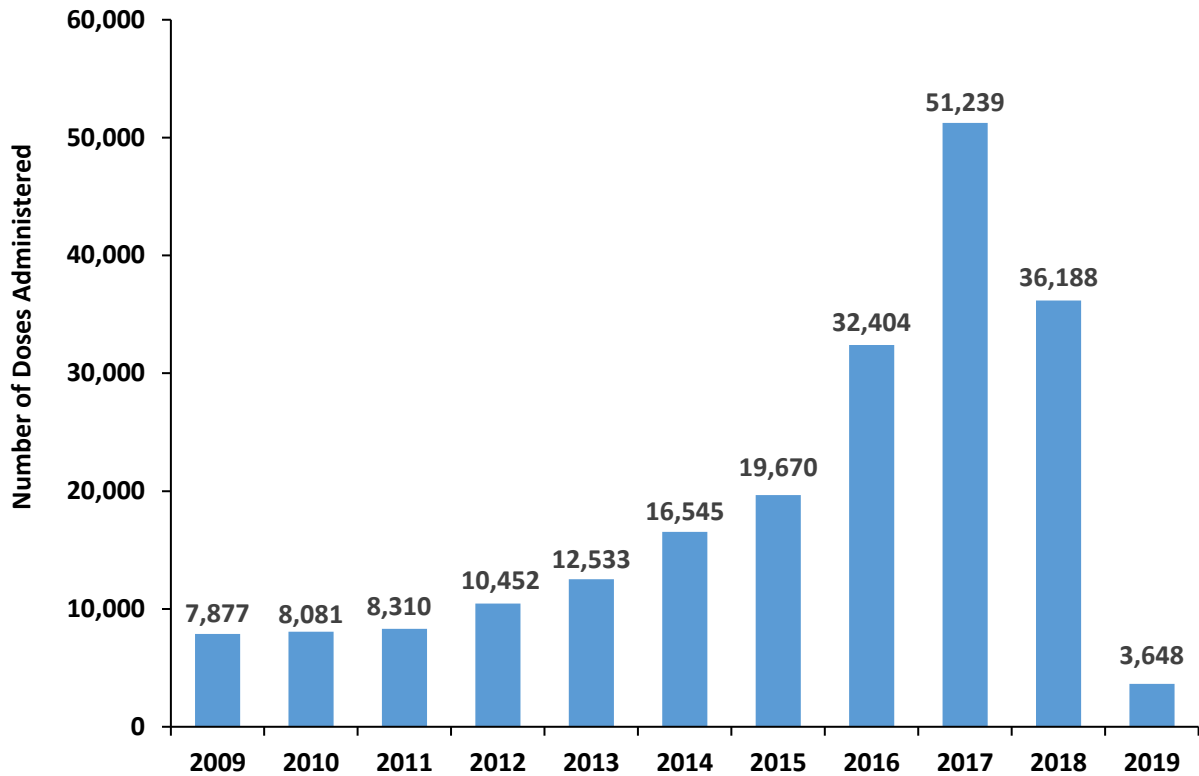

<sup>3</sup> The data includes naloxone administrations where county was not recorded (blank/unknown) n=145 (2016), n=96 (2017), n=66 (2018), and n=3 (2019).

<sup>4</sup> Naloxone doses administered in out of state ZIP codes are excluded.

<sup>5</sup> As of February 19, 2019, 820 of the 1,013 known transporting EMS agencies (80.9%) in 2018 reported through EMSIRS.

<sup>6</sup> As of February 19, 2019, 755 of the 1,020 known transporting EMS agencies (74.0%) in 2019 reported through EMSIRS.
