


Naloxone Administration by Ohio EMS Providers, 2009-2020^{1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8}

² Reported naloxone administration data for “Out of Ohio” and “Blank/Unknown” counties and ZIP codes for CY2009 – CY2012 have been removed to eliminate data integrity concerns between multiple EMSIRS and national guidelines.

³ The data includes naloxone administrations where county was not recorded (blank/unknown/out of state): n=77 (2018), n=53 (2019), and n=31 (2020).

⁴ Naloxone doses administered in out of state ZIP codes are excluded.

⁵ As of July 6, 2020, 843 of the 1,021 known transporting EMS agencies (82.6%) in 2019 reported data through the legacy EMSIRS.

⁶ As of October 13, 2020, 860 of the 1,018 known transporting EMS agencies (84.5%) in 2020 reported data through the new EMSIRS.

⁷ The accuracy of data reported to EMSIRS is limited by the number of individual EMS agencies submitting data and the accuracy of these submissions.

⁸ These data represent the total number of naloxone administrations recorded by EMS staff. They do not represent the total number of administrations provided in the entire state.
