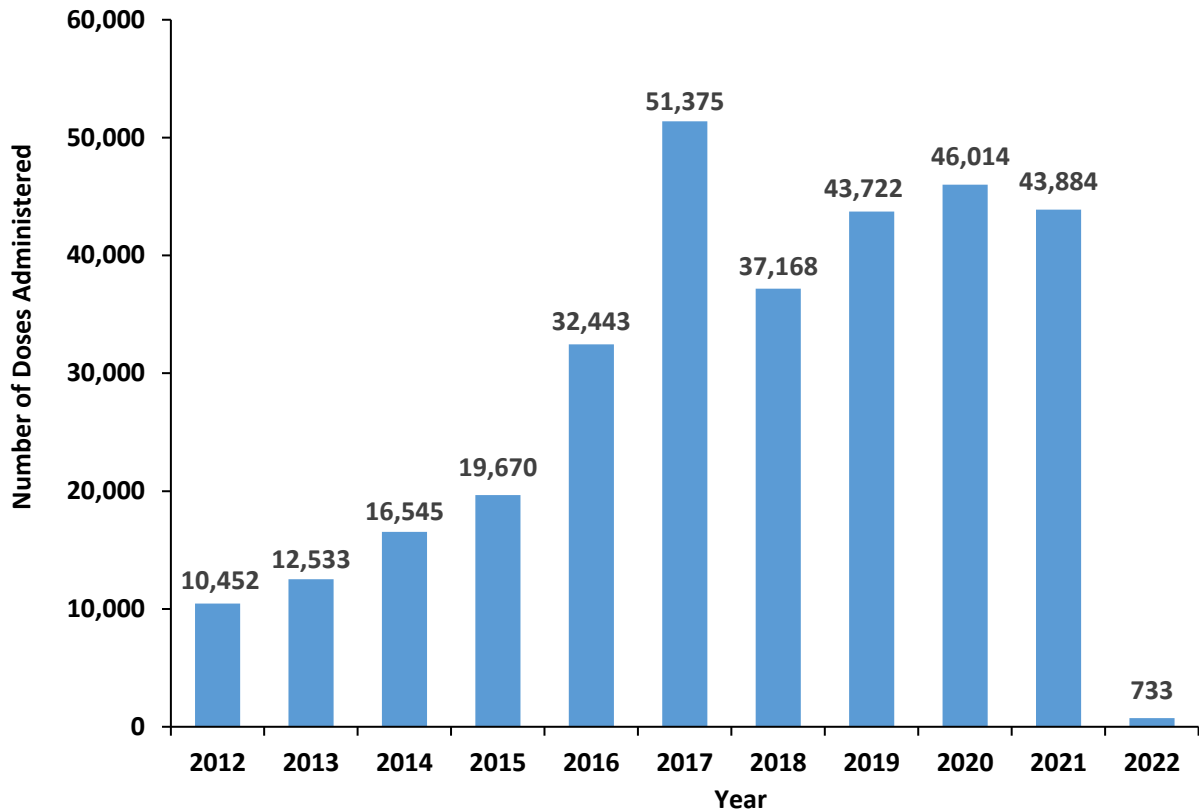

² Reported naloxone administration data for “Out of Ohio” and “Blank/Unknown” counties and ZIP codes for CY2009 – CY2012 have been removed to eliminate data integrity concerns between multiple EMSIRS and national guidelines.

³ The data includes naloxone administrations where county was not recorded (blank/unknown/out of state): n=57 (2020), n = 63 (2021), and n = 0 (2022).

⁴ Naloxone doses administered in out of state ZIP codes are excluded.

⁵ As of January 10, 2022, 746 of the 1,008 known transporting EMS agencies (74.0%) in 2022 reported data through the new EMSIRS.

⁶ As of January 10, 2022, 865 of the 1,009 known transporting EMS agencies (85.7%) in 2021 reported data through the new EMSIRS.

⁷ The accuracy of data reported to EMSIRS is limited by the number of individual EMS agencies submitting data and the accuracy of these submissions.
